WHEN YOU DRIVE BY THE EUREKA CHAMBER THESE DAYS.....YOU MIGHT NOTICE A BIT OF A DIFFERENCE.

THE BUILDING HAS BEEN REPAINTED, THE GROUNDS COMPLETELY RENNOVATED WITH NEW LANDSCAPING, PLANTS AND TREES. CHECK IT OUT THE NEXT TIME YOU DRIVE BY.

THE RECENT LANDSCAPING PROJECT WAS ACCOMPLISHED THROUGH THE COMBINED VOLUNTEER EFFORTS AND DONATIONS OF MANY CHAMBER MEMBER BUSINESSES.

TO NAME ONLY A FEW, JACK REIKE AND SHAFER'S ACE HARDWARE, LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS THOMAS MEAGER AND AMY BERKOWITZ, TEEN CHALLENGE...EARTHSCAPES AND CAMPTON ELECTRIC.

DURING THE PROCESS SOMEBODY OFFERED TO REFINISH MY DESK. IT'S BEEN THERE SINCE 1956. IT CAME WITH THE BUILDING THAT ERNIE PIERSON AND THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY VOLUNTEERED TO CONSTRUCT. BACK THEN....BUSINESS LEADERS MADE A DEAL WITH THE CITY.....THEY SAID WE'LL PUT UP A BUILDING ON THE OLD PUMP SITE ON HAWTHORNE AND BROADWAY.......GIVE US A LONG TERM LEASE AND WE'LL COVER THE EXPENSES. IF WE HELP BUSINESSES TO SUCCEED, THE CITY SUCCEEDS. SO....THE CHAMBER OFFICES WERE BUILT IN THE TRUE SPIRIT OF A PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP IN 1957. SINCE THEN, CHAMBER MEMBERS HAVE COVERED EVERY EXPENSE AT NO COST TO THE CITY.

THE POINT IS THAT A WHOLE LOT OF BUSINESSES STEPPED UP TO MAKE THIS WORK. IT'S ALWAYS BEEN THAT WAY. THAT'S HOW THE SAMOA BRIDGE WAS BUILT AND THE MATTHEWS DAM CREATED.
