On Tuesday, June Twelfth, the Humboldt County Planning Commission submitted the draft General Plan Update and EIR to the County Board of Supervisors. This has been in the works for a decade with seventy eight public hearings held over the past three years. Many hours have been spent, which is admirable, but does that time spent guarantee a flawless document? From what I hear and read, far from it. A draft of this magnitude will not be agreed upon by everyone but it sounds like the controversy is not limited to a small number of citizens. Where does all this information, contained in the draft, come from? How many pages make up these documents and have everyone involved read and digested them? There are questions regarding some of the ideas contained in the document which seem to reflect some of the beliefs of "Agenda Twenty One". "Agenda Twenty One", a quiet attempt to move toward World Government, is becoming more widely known to the public. Citizens who believe in the sovereignty of the United States don't like what they hear and read about "Agenda Twenty One" and rightfully so. They don't want to lose their rights to a socialistic program. Your question at this point is probably "This is international stuff and our national government will take care of the problem, why get excited at this level?" My friends; this level is where government starts and who knows that better than the champions of "Agenda Twenty One." For years now, they have been working to bring community leaders into their camp.
